An Open Letter to Governor J.B. Pritzker, Mayor Brandon Johnson, Related Midwest, PsiQuantum, University Related Organizations, the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA), the Chicago Department of Planning and Development, the Chicago Park District, Clayco, educational institutions, and all other entities involved in the creation of the South Works Quantum campus (a.k.a. Illinois Quantum Microelectronics Park - IQMP).

We want to thank the representatives of organizations involved in developing the South Works Quantum campus who came to meet with a robust turnout of community members on August 28, 2024. As a follow up, we submit this letter to suggest next steps.

Before proceeding with the City of Chicago Planned Development process and other permits or approvals for the South Works Quantum campus, the Coalition for a South Works CBA, Chicago's Citywide Equitable Development Roundtable, and other organizations listed below demand adequate notice of ongoing public meetings, in the spirit of Open Meetings policy, for the purpose of establishing a committee of community leaders to engage in good faith, legally binding negotiations around the following items as addressed in the Redevelopment Agreement (RDA) and/or other appropriate documents:

- A public transparent **environmental impact** study and environmental impact plan that includes topics such as effects on water, noise, emissions, chemical use, and a clear transparent assessment of site contamination as well as remediation plans and risk mitigations.
- **Competitive jobs** with living or prevailing wages for local neighborhood residents, both before and after construction, as well as training that creates a jobs pipeline, career pathways, and opportunities for advancement, for community residents.
- Funding for **measures to prevent displacement**, such as affordable housing construction, property tax relief, maintenance programs, technical assistance, community wealth building, small business assistance, and others.
- A **robust technology infrastructure** for the existing communities, as well as the development.

- A clear transparent assessment and plan to avoid any **other effects on the neighborhood, such as traffic, noise, emissions, heightened security, or other issues.**
- A clear line of **communication and problem resolution** process between IQMP and neighboring community leaders.
- Continued access to and improved amenities for the **lakefront and neighboring parks and athletic facilities**, such as Steelworkers Park, the South end of Rainbow Beach Park, the undeveloped Park 566 along the lakefront, and the mouth of the Calumet
- **Investment in our neighborhood schools and the education of southeast side students** to train the next generation to work at facilities like these as per the third component of the National Quantum Strategy

- **Fiscal accountability** for government funding that prioritizes those investment returns for local residents over private investors.
- **Community representatives** on the Governance committee.

Too often, neighbors in this area and other parts of Chicago are not invited and are left in the dark in the planning stages of planned developments impacting our communities, or a sham of public engagement is made after all the decisions have been made behind closed doors. Most residents, unless they are members of organized groups, still don't know that big changes are coming. The lack of information about the project has not been reassuring.
